#### Words Defined

**Testify:** to be adduced as a witness, take to record

**Positive:** good or useful

**Negative:** harmful or bad: not wanted

**Complain:** express dissatisfaction or annoyance about a state of affairs or an event

**Encourage:** to make (someone) more determined, hopeful, or confident

**Power:** the ability or right to control people or things

**Speak:** to utter a voice or say (by word or writing)

**Idle:** unemployed, lazy, useless

**Judge:** to decide

**Abundance:** surplus, what is left over.

In the beginning God spoke. Except for creating man, God created all things by speaking, **Genesis 1:3, Psalm 33:6-9.** God chose preaching (words spoken) to save man. God chose prophets to tell (talk, words spoken) others about His judgments, prophecy, blessings, etc. (throughout the books in the Bible) In order to be saved you need to hear the spoken words of a preacher.

**Romans 10:14-18** The only way to Jesus is through words, when we pray. The only way to help someone in need is to pray. Repentance is made when we plead forgiveness with our words through **confession** and we chose to turn to God and His ways; **1 John 1:9.** The **Holy Ghost** is recognized in a life through the words spoken; Tongues; **Acts 2:4.** The abundance of your **heart** is revealed through your words; **Luke 6:45.** And in the end, we will be **judged** by our words; **Matthew 12:34-37.**

**James 3:2-18** talks about how unruly our tongue is. When we receive the Holy Ghost, the tongue is yielded to God and our known language is transformed into a heavenly language. Through the power of the Holy Ghost With our words we try to justify our actions, and, if someone agrees with us, then, in our own minds we validate those actions.

In **James 5:16** is says to “Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed . . . “ it doesn’t say to complain to one another, about one another. Could that be the reason why so many of us are still sick? With our words we complain, and, if someone join in on the complaint, then a simple complaint becomes this ginormous monster, difficult to kill.

When we speak words of negativity about someone via; complaints, gossip, talebearing, news, rumors, and such, we become a witness or an accuser. As in a court of law. We testify of that which we have heard, saw, lived through, or even made up. Those words go forth in the spirit world in God’s Spiritual Courtroom against your fellow man or against you. We become the witness, testifying on their case that Satan has against them. Do you want held responsible for another’s soul in hell? Do you think that you can escape hell if you had condemned another? **Matthew 7:1-2** When Jesus testified He became responsible for His Words. **John 7:7**

Your positive words can boost another, and your negative words can destroy another. We are responsible for every word, we will have to give an account for every idle word spoken. Read **Matthew 12:34-37** often, just to remind you that God considers each word we say extremely important. Reflect: **Colossians 4:6.**

*We can create or destroy in our own lives just by what we declare. Do you claim to be sick or do you refuse any such notion? Do you claim to yourself doom and gloom, or do you proclaim blessings and favor? Now that you know how powerful your words are, take a step back and review the words before you speak.*
